Please read this document in full before commencing your application

This document provides step-by-step instructions for Australians on how to complete the application correctly. Applicants are encouraged to print this document and keep it nearby as they complete the application.

- If successful, applicants applying for this cycle must commence their program between **1 August 2024 – 31 May 2025**. Please consider this when planning your proposed program.
- Late applications will not be accepted.
- Please read the eligibility requirements on the website before commencing an application.
- Recommenders must submit their statements online before the application deadline above to be included in the application.
- All applications must be completed (using these instructions) via the online application portal.
- Please read this document in full to prepare the necessary documentation before commencing your application.
- Please review your completed application before submitting it, using the checklist provided to ensure all elements are included.

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General Information

The application is supported by all modern browsers. We recommend that you use a current version of [Google Chrome](https://www.google.com/chrome/), which supports Windows, Mac, and Linux platforms.

Prior to starting an application, please read the information below.

Step 1: Learn the requirements for submitting an application

Before you begin an application, please visit the Australian Fulbright website for comprehensive information on suitability, eligibility and application requirements for a Fulbright scholarship:

Step 2: Record username and password in a safe place

Your email address is your username. When you create an account for this online application, record your password in a secure place. You can log in and out of the application as frequently as you like using your username and password. If necessary, you can reset your password by clicking the “Forgot Your Password” link on the log-in page.

Step 3: Complete the application

You do not need to complete this application at one time. You can re-enter at any time to edit your application. However, once you SUBMIT your application, you CANNOT make changes to it.

To complete your application correctly, please answer all questions completely and carefully. Review these additional tips:

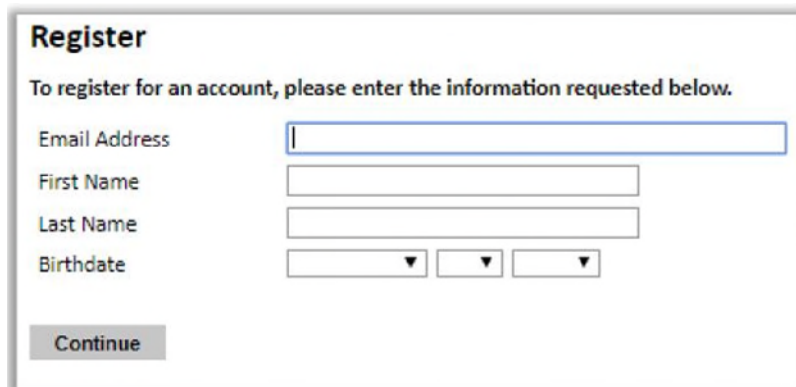
- Use upper and lower-case letters (e.g., John Smith). Avoid using all capital letters (e.g., JOHN SMITH). Do not use special characters, such as accent marks.
- You can copy and paste information into all text boxes.
- Limit your responses to the space provided in all text boxes.
- Prepare required documents and save them in PDF format. It is highly recommended that to preserve any formatting and special characters in your documents, you upload them in PDF format.
- Some questions are “required.” They are marked with an asterisk (*). You will not be able to submit your application until all required items are complete.

Step 4: Submit the application

Once you have entered all required information, including recommenders, review your application for errors. If all information is correct, submit your application. Once you submit you CANNOT make changes to your application, but your referees can still submit their reports prior to the deadline for them to be considered by Fulbright.

Creating Your Online Account

1. Go to <https://apply.iie.org/ffsp2024>
2. Please read all instructions carefully before completing the application.
3. To start, click *Create an account*.
4. Enter your email address, first name, last name, and select your date of birth (Month-Date-Year) from the drop-down menus. **Your name must be entered exactly the way it appears (or will appear) on your passport.**

Note: Use an email address that you will be able to access for at least 2 years after submitting your application. This is the email address you will use to log in to your application account. We recommend you do **NOT** use a work email address if you will not have access to it during your grant in the United States. Applicants who have applied in previous years must use the same email address they used in previous years.

5. Click Continue. You will receive an email from apply@iie.org confirming that you have started the application. The email will include a temporary PIN. Follow the instructions in the email to activate your account using the temporary PIN.
6. You will be prompted to enter your pin, re-enter your date of birth and then create a password to complete login.

7. Returning users: Click *Log in* and enter your email address and password. If you do not remember your password, click *Forgot your password?* and follow the resulting instructions. Ensure you click on the 2024 – 2025 cycle to start a new application.

Managing Your Application

EDITING YOUR APPLICATION PRIOR TO SUBMISSION

1. You may log in at any time to review and edit your application form, upload documents, and enter recommender information.
2. Remember to save your application after completing each page by pressing the *Continue* button at the bottom of each page.

Note: The application will automatically log you out after 60 minutes of inactivity, so it is best to save your application frequently.

REVIEWING YOUR APPLICATION AFTER SUBMISSION

1. After you SUBMIT your application, you CANNOT make any changes.
2. You may continue to log in to your account to view the information you have submitted, save a PDF of your application form, and manage your recommenders.
3. You can manage your recommenders by clicking on the *Recommendations* section of the online application.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

1. Once you register your recommenders, they will receive an automatic email with instructions on completing the online recommendation form.
2. Letters of recommendation will be submitted directly to Fulbright by the recommenders you registered via your application.
3. Letters of recommendation and language evaluations may be submitted before or after you submit the application.
4. If your recommender is unavailable, you will have the option to exclude the recommender and add an alternative after you submit the application.

Preliminary Questions

These questions address essential program eligibility. All questions are required. **Please note you are applying for 2024-2025 academic year.**

1. Select the country (Australia) through which you are applying for the Fulbright grant from the dropdown menu.
2. Select the appropriate program year (2024-2025) from the dropdown menu.
3. U.S. Citizenship, Dual Citizenship with the U.S. or Permanent Residency: select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate your response.
 - a. Please note applicants cannot be U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the U.S. to participate in the Fulbright Visiting Scholar Program, but may hold dual citizenship in another country
4. Select 'yes', 'no', or 'unsure' to indicate if you are aware and meet all program eligibility requirements.
 - a. These instructions are used for many countries associated with Fulbright, please visit the Australian-American Fulbright website to review the program eligibility requirements <https://www.fulbright.org.au/applicants/australian-applicants/>
5. Carefully review the Data Privacy information. If prompted, indicate your acceptance of data privacy terms by selecting 'Yes' or 'No'.
 - a. You will not be able to submit your application without indicating your agreement to the Data Privacy terms.
5. Select 'Yes' or 'No' to indicate if you meet all employment eligibility requirements.
 - a. Applicants or applicants' immediate family cannot have been employed by the stated organizations and/or agencies within the year prior to application.
 - b. If you select 'Yes', please provide details of employment or association.

6. Select 'Yes' or 'No' to indicate whether you waive your right to review the information contained in the evaluations submitted by recommenders on your behalf.
7. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Country Information

3. If prompted, you must select an award before proceeding.
4. Click *Continue* to proceed to the next section.

Personal Information

Enter all required biographical information.

1. **Name:** Enter your name exactly as it appears on your passport. Only enter a preferred name if it is DIFFERENT than your legal name (e.g., Alex instead of Alexander).
2. **Name on previous records:** If your name is recorded differently on any previous records, list it in the Name on Previous Records section (e.g., maiden name).
3. **Biographical information:** The birthdate that you used to create your account will automatically appear. Enter your city of birth, country of birth, sex (as it appears or will appear on your passport or travel document), preferred gender identity, marital status, and number of dependents.
4. List any form of limitation that may require accommodation.
5. **Citizenship Information:** Select your country of citizenship and country of residence from the dropdown menus provided.
6. If applicable, enter your national identification number and any additional countries in which you hold citizenship.
 - a. To select multiple countries, hold down the CTRL (PC) or Command (Mac) button when selecting options.
7. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Contact Information

Enter all required contact information.

1. **ADDRESS:** Select the **country where you live** from the dropdown list first when entering your permanent address (i.e., physical address where you currently live).
 - a. Based on your country selection, the subsequent fields will change to match the address format of that country.
 - b. Complete the remaining address fields. Do not use accents or special characters.
 - c. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if your current mailing address (i.e., the address where you receive mail) is the same as the permanent address you entered above. *They do not have to be the same.*
 - d. If you answer 'no,' then a second address section will appear where you may enter your mailing address information.
 - e. If you answer 'yes' to this question, proceed immediately to the next section.
2. **TELEPHONE NUMBERS:** Enter your contact numbers as appropriate. Include the country code. If the field turns red, please review the numbers that you have entered to look for any errors.
 - a. To find the correct country code, click on the blue 'country code' link.
 - b. Australia's country code is +61.
3. **EMAIL:** The email address used to create your account will appear in the primary email address field and will not be editable. You may provide an Alternate/Secondary Email that can be used to contact you if Fulbright Program officers cannot reach you via your primary email address. **Note:** All system-generated emails will continue to go to your primary email address, and you will be contacted by the Fulbright Commission at this email address regarding the status of your application.
4. **EMERGENCY CONTACT:** Entering emergency contact information is required for your home in Australia. The individuals you list may be contacted in the event of an emergency while you are participating in grant activities.
 - a. When entering the address, choose the country that corresponds to your emergency contacts' address first and the following fields will update to match the address format of the selected country.
 - b. At this stage you are not required to enter an emergency contact for the United States
5. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Academic & Professional Information

This section collects information about your academic and professional background, including your curriculum vitae/resumé, academic degrees, professional experience, organisational memberships, letter of support from home institution, experience abroad, and previous Fulbright grants, if applicable.

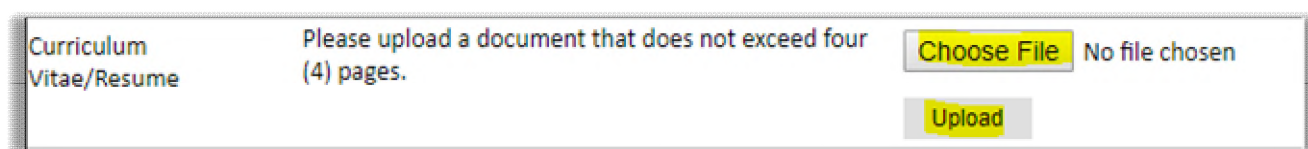
Prepare and upload documents in PDF format as required. Note any page limits and ensure your documents do not exceed page limits.

Curriculum Vitae/Resume

Upload your curriculum vitae/resumé in PDF format **that does not exceed four (4) pages**.

Note: If your file exceeds 4 pages, an error message will appear on the Review page and will prevent submission of your application.

- Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer
- Click *Open*
- Click *Upload* to complete the file upload

The curriculum vitae describes academic credentials and demonstrates a record of scholarly achievements. When composing a curriculum vitae, it is important to include:

- Education (universities attended, degrees earned, and dates received)
- Professional positions held
- Courses taught, and other services provided to students and the home institution
- Publications (provide full citations and list them starting with the most recent)
- Other professional activities, such as workshops, seminars and consultations
- Membership and activities in professional associations
- Professional honors, awards and fellowships
- Community service

The application asks for similar information but provides limited space for answers. In the curriculum vitae, you should expand upon these topics to display your accomplishments in full.

Please note, copies of transcripts are required.

Academic Background

List all post-secondary educational institutions from which you have received a degree or academic credential, in order of **most recently completed (reverse chronological order)**. You **MUST** include any

education institutions you are currently attending (even if you have not yet completed your educational program) and estimated date of graduation/completion.

- a. Click *Add New Academic Background*
- b. Type in the name of the institution
- c. Choose the level of study (graduate or undergraduate) from the dropdown menu
- d. Select the country where the institution is located from the dropdown menu
- e. Enter the appropriate city and region/state
- f. Provide the website of the institution (optional)
- g. Select the U.S. equivalent of the degree or diploma earned (e.g., BA – bachelor’s degree)
- h. If relevant, provide the actual name of the degree or diploma (e.g., license)
- i. Enter the discipline in which this degree or diploma was earned
- j. Enter your final cumulative Grade Point Average, as noted in your transcript or diploma
- k. Enter the highest possible Grade Point Average at your institution
- l. Select the month and year of start and end dates (Month – Year format) that you attended this institution. If a degree is in progress, list expected end date of academic program
- m. Click *Save*.

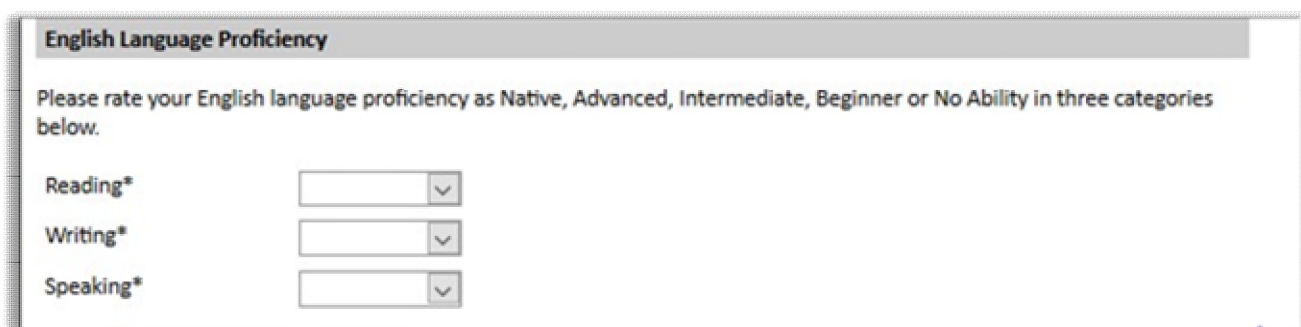

- a. Select the corresponding institution from the list.
- b. Review the institution information (which you provided on the previous page). If this information is incorrect, please return to the previous page to edit.
 - If you do not see an institution that you attended below, you may either return to the Academic & Professional Information page and update your academic background or add the institution by clicking the “Add Institution” link.
- c. Select *Choose File* and locate the desired file on your computer. Click *Open*.
 - You may upload transcripts/diplomas as a multi-page documents or upload single page documents. PDF, JPEG, and TIFF image files are all accepted.
- d. Click *Save*. Repeat these steps for all applicable institutions.
- e. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Language Skills

This section collects information about your native language, English language skills, and any additional languages that are relevant to your project proposal.

1. **Native Language:** Select your native language from the dropdown menu provided.
2. **English Language Proficiency:** If your native language is not English, a section collecting your English language proficiency will appear.

Standardized Test Scores

This section collects information about standardized test scores that you have taken or will take in the future. Standardized tests include TOEFL, GRE, GMAT and IELTS. Standardized test scores are often required for admission to U.S. institutions as master's or PhD seeking students. Degree seeking students do not need to have completed these tests at the time of application but should plan on having the relevant tests complete by **1 October 2023 at the latest**.

- a. If you have taken any of these tests, select *Add Test*.
- b. Select the test type from the dropdown menu.
- c. Select the test date from the dropdown menu (Month-Day-Year format).
 - If you have not yet taken the test, enter the date that you are registered to take the test.
- d. Enter your test scores, if you have the results from the test.
- e. Click *Save*. Repeat these steps for all applicable standardized tests.
- f. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Plagiarism Agreement

Carefully review the Plagiarism Agreement and indicate your acceptance of the terms by selecting 'Yes' or 'No'.

Plagiarism in any part of your application will result in your disqualification from participating in the Fulbright Program.

Plagiarism will be understood to include any of the following:

Presenting wording, statistics or concepts as your own which should be attributed to someone else or to publications (online or offline). This includes, but is not limited to:

- Copying the exact wording of a written source (with or without citation)
- Presenting material with alterations in wording (with or without citation)
- Paraphrasing the content of a source without citation

It is expected that your responses to all questions in the following application will be your own work and writing, with clear citation of secondary sources if describing academic work and the writing of others (including one's own previously published work). Any sources used in the construction of your responses must be clearly cited.

Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Study Plan

This section collects information about your proposed plan of study in the U.S. Please carefully review country-specific guidance to determine if you must submit any additional documentation.

1. Select the degree objective to which you are applying.
2. Select the most appropriate major academic discipline and primary specialization from the dropdown menus.
 - a. Some fields, such as Arts and Architecture, will trigger a message that you are required to upload portfolio materials as part of your application. You will be able to upload materials on the next page.
3. Enter a brief description of the field in which you plan to specialize in the U.S. in the text box.
4. Enter a brief description of your future plans in the text box.

Intended Grant Period (Required)

Enter your proposed length of stay in the U.S. and select your proposed date of arrival in the U.S. (Month-Day-Year format) from the dropdown menu. Typically, degree seeking students will begin in August/September of the proposed academic year.

Study/Research Objective (Required)

Upload a copy of your study/research objective. The **study/research objective** description that you provide is a highly important part of your application. It helps the reader better understand your proposed study goals. You should take great care to write a clear and very detailed description of the program you want to pursue. This statement should be **three (3) pages in PDF format (not including your references)** which is an essential part of your application and is required. **If you are applying to complete a degree in the U.S., do NOT mention specific U.S. universities in which you would like to study.**

- Be specific about your degree/research objective, major field, and specialized interests within this field.
 - Explain why you are interested in this area.
 - Describe the kind of program you expect to undertake.
 - How does this fit into your educational background?
 - How does this fit into your future objectives and goals?
 - (Degree seeking students only) If you prefer a program that focuses on theoretical vs. practical application or technical vs. policy, include this as well.
 - How are your research interests relevant to current trends/challenges in Australia?
 - How will you apply your studies/research upon returning to Australia?
 - Degree seeking students only- References to proposed universities or faculty should not be made.
 - The essay should be at least three (3) pages and no longer than four (4) pages. Please use your own words and avoid plagiarism. If you are planning to use someone else's works or research, you must always credit the source (additional 1 page of references).
- a. Click *Choose File*
 - b. Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer

- c. Click *Open*
- d. Click *Upload* to complete the file upload

Personal Statement (Required)

The **personal statement** is a **one (1) page** narrative statement in which **you give the reader more insight into you as an individual and your future contributions**. It should include information about your education, practical experience, special interests, career plans, and your purpose in applying for study. Your personal statement **should not** be a recap of your CV/resume.

- Explain who you are, what is important to you and what you intend to accomplish in your life.
 - Demonstrate your unique qualifications for your chosen field.
 - Discuss experiences, people, and events that inspired you to pursue this field of study.
 - Demonstrate your commitment to your field of study.
 - What kind of contribution do you want to make?
 - What do you intend to do with your degree?
 - Please use your own words and avoid plagiarism. If you are planning to use someone else's works or research, you must always credit the source.
- a. Click *Choose File*
 - b. Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer
 - c. Click *Open*
 - d. Click *Upload* to complete the file upload

Writing Sample (Required for Degree Seeking students)

Upload a writing sample. This is required for all PhD (Doctoral) applicants. Select Master's fields may also require a writing sample. If you are applying as a Visiting Student Researcher, this is not required.

The **writing sample** (WS) should always be related to your field of study and ideally within the area of specialization you are applying for. The sample should be **10-20 pages** in length including cover page and bibliography/references.

- The WS should be a sample of your best work to enhance your application:
 - It should be well written and show a good grasp of English.
 - It should reflect your analytical thinking ability.
 - It should show your grasp of the complexity of the topic.
- The WS can be a published work or an original writing sample.
 - If it is a published work, you should be the lead author of the article.
 - If a published work, it should be from a peer reviewed publication.
 - If it is an original writing sample, a chapter from a thesis or a senior project paper is ideal.
- Pay attention to the writing style.
- Different fields of study may expect you to be familiar with the recommended writing style, these are:
 - Humanities, Liberal Arts, Fine Arts – MLA style

- Social Sciences, Education, Biological & Earth Sciences, Business, Linguistics, Anthropology – APA style
- Sciences – CSE (Formerly CBE)

Recommendations

It is **strongly recommended** that you have three (3) letters of recommendation submitted on your behalf. Letters of recommendation are an extremely important aspect of your application; an application will be considered incomplete without ***at least two*** letters of recommendation. Your recommenders must complete the forms online and submit electronically.

Once you register your recommenders, they will receive an automatic email with instructions on completing the online recommendation form. You can track the status of recommendations, send reminders, and add/delete recommenders through this system before **and** after submission of your application. **Late recommendations cannot be accepted.**

Tips on recommendations:

- Please provide your recommenders with a copy of your project statement.
- Recommendations should be from people qualified to evaluate your professional work; the abilities you bring to the proposed project; your ability to adapt to another country and culture; and the merits of the project itself.
- We recommend that you do not ask someone for a letter of recommendation unless the person is well acquainted with your qualifications. A pro forma letter from a well-known scholar, a contact abroad or a prominent government official will carry less weight than a realistic assessment of your abilities from someone who knows you and your work well.
- Recommendations can come from your home institution; however, we suggest that at least one of them be from a colleague in your field outside your home institution.
- If you have recently moved to a new home institution, you may elect to have one of your recommenders be from your previous institution.
- Choose your recommenders carefully and contact them early. The letters of recommendation need to accompany the application. One single letter of recommendation will not be accepted, the minimum number of recommendations is two.
- Recommendations must be written in or translated into English.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that recommendation reports are submitted by the deadline.

PLEASE NOTE: To submit your application, the online application portal **requires** you to send 3 recommenders an invitation to complete a recommendation. While we recommend that all 3 respond, **at least 2** of these recommenders are required to submit a recommendation on your behalf for your final application to be considered complete. 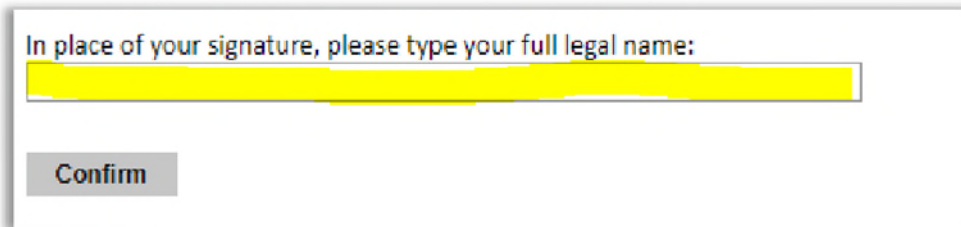
